

A Letter from the President

It was a year of firsts for Hunters Point Parks Conservancy. In June we launched our first annual LIC Post Run the Waterfront 5K that brought over 1,200 people to the Long Island City waterfront parks. Runners began in Hunters Point Park, went through the streets of Long Island City, looped back through Gantry Plaza State Park and finished in Hunters Point Park. In July we launched our Summer Kids program with Gantry Parent Association. Our inaugural program had over 40 events that attracted over 2,000 children. In August we hosted events such as the Queens Literary Festival.

We continued popular programming, too. CinemaLIC screened six outdoor movies such as *Zootopia*, *Ghost* and *Big* in partnership with our sponsor, Nest Seekers. For music and dance lovers, we sponsored Wednesdays on the Waterfront with dance lessons, DJs and salsa.

We also held community events such as the two LIC Henge Parties when the setting sun aligned perfectly with the east-west streets in Manhattan. In August we hosted *Seinfeld in the Park for the Summer of George*, which featured favorite shows, an Elaine dance-off, and black and white cookies.

Amid the fun, we also worked to keep the parks looking beautiful. Beginning in April and through October volunteers weeded, planted, mulched and picked up litter. The Conservancy received a \$13,800 grant from New York State that paid to replace broken Adirondack chairs, lighting fixtures and damaged tree guards.

In the fall we hosted the second annual LIC Bulbfest where we planted 5,000 daffodil bulbs throughout Gantry Plaza State Park and Hunters Point South Park. In January we mulched 1,550 Christmas trees at our annual Mulchfest.

To meet our mission, we partnered with community groups, elected officials and park enthusiasts. For much of our programming we used local artists or vendors. We brought in community arts groups such as the Secret Theatre, LIC Entertainment, McManus Irish Dance Studio and Queens Dance Festival.

As more people discover the beauty and tranquility of Hunters Point South Park and Gantry Plaza State Park, park attendance will continue to increase. We are excited about the new Hunters Point Library that will open this winter, and a second ferry stop at the north end of Gantry Plaza State Park. The next tower of Hunters Point South Living is expected to break ground soon, and in 2018 the Phase 2 extension of Hunters Point South Park opens.

As our community continues to evolve and grow, Hunters Point Parks Conservancy will continue its mission of enriching the quality of life in Hunters Point by preserving and enhancing its parks, green spaces and waterfront. 

A Conversation with Mark Christie

When you moved to Queens West in 1997, what was the area like?

There were abandoned buildings, garbage piled up, and even a pack of feral dogs — if you can believe that.

We had these beautiful green spaces throughout Hunters Point, but they were filled with trash and were not being taken care of.

What caused you to start the Friends of Gantry, which later morphed into the Hunters Point Parks Conservancy?

I thought there was a lot of neglect around LIC, including the park. The park was our own little jewel, and I would go through the grass and pick up cigarette butts, trash, and all sorts of things that you wouldn't think people would leave in this green space.

I then met people in the community, so I asked a neighbor if he wanted to help me clean the park. And then we asked another person. And pretty soon we had an active group of concerned people working together to improve the park. Soon we were meeting every Saturday as a collective group with a goal of making the park as nice as possible. A number of us even took a three-month course from Tree Pruners of NYC to become certified Citizen Tree Pruners. We also started to weed the park and bring new life by adding plants and flowers.

With the opening of the Hunters Point South Park, the Friends of Gantry morphed into the **Hunters Point Parks Conservancy** so we could more efficiently and effectively raise and earmark funds for the green space.

What is your hope for the future of the park and LIC?

I want residents to take ownership. The park is their space and I want for each and every person of LIC to say:

"We love Hunters Point parks and we cherish them."

To add to the feeling of community ownership, HPPC wants to see more involvement from local residents. We are open to any ideas that will enhance the community and take advantage of the wonderful elements the park can provide.

One thing we are really excited about in the upcoming year is the Queens Library at Hunters Point. In the prospectus of Queens West development, there were words about a Queens Library branch. Gantry Plaza State Park is a perfect location for a stand-alone library near the waterfront. As a member, I formed a committee to advocate for the library, and we are proud to say that the groundbreaking was in May 2015 and library will open later this year.

I cannot tell you how much we cherish this neighborhood and the waterfront. We look forward to continuing our goal to support and enhance the waterfront parks in Hunters Point through events, education and conservation, so people can enjoy the area for decades to come.

It is a pleasure to work with the Conservancy volunteers and community members to create great activities on the waterfront and to keep the parks looking great.

We will continue to improve our quality of life here in Hunters Point, Queens — the World's Borough!

Summer Kids at the Landing






In July, Hunters Point Parks Conservancy and the Gantry Parent Association launched its sevenweek series to offer family friendly programming for children. Recognizing the influx of young families to the neighborhood, HPPC and GPA provided free activities ranging from interactive music classes, dance demonstrations, and arts and crafts. Hosted on the LIC waterfront, the events drew thousands of kids through engaging programs for children and adults.

One of the summer's highlights was the exotic animal show that drew over 200 people to see these spectacular animals up close. Kids were able to see and touch hedgehogs, chinchillas, macaws, snakes, and many other animals!

The summer program concluded with a performance from the Secret Theatre's children's musical, *Pirate Pete's Parrot*. In the tradition of the wildly popular English pantomime shows, Pirate Pete's Parrot provides music, mischief, and a boatload of laughs for children and adults.

LIC Post Waterfront Run 5K

Mulchfest

In early January, Hunters Point Parks Conservancy in conjunction with the New York City Department of Parks & Recreation, the New York City Department of Sanitation, and GreeNYC, hosted Mulchfest to recycle holiday trees into mulch that will nourish plantings across the city.

In 2016, almost 600 trees were mulched at Hunters Point South Park and over 30,000 trees were mulched citywide. In 2017, thanks to the sustainable and environmentally conscious efforts of our community, we mulched 1,535 trees—one of the largest Mulchfests in Queens.




