



2018 Annual Report 2018 was a landmark year for the Hunters Point Parks Conservancy, our parks and the Long Island City neighborhood. Phase 2 of Hunter's Point South Park opened in June to universal praise and awe. The Conservancy provided record programming, increased funding and volunteer support to the parks. Long Island City continued to be the fastest growing community in the country.

PROGRAMMING

We provided an ever widening range of diverse programming. This year we offered 158 events that attracted over 16,000 people. The programming included fitness, concerts, art classes, dance festivals and outdoor movies. For the third year, we presented Summer Kids in July and August that offered 51 free classes for about 4,000 younger members of our community. Our successful 3rd annual LIC Post 5K Run in June attracted 1,300 runners.

PARK MAINTENANCE

The Conservancy continued to advocate for funding for both Hunter's Point South Park and Gantry Plaza State Park. Since 2016, through grants and other fund raising efforts, we have provided Gantry Plaza State Park with over \$60,000 for park enhancements. In 2018, we invested \$50,000 in programming events in Hunter's Point South Park.

In 2018, we contributed nearly 1,500 volunteer hours towards gardening and park clean up. This included our

4th Annual LIC Bulbfest in November when we planted 7,500 daffodil and tulip bulbs. During the last four years, we have planted over 25,000 bulbs in both parks.

OUR GOALS

Much has been accomplished, but much needs to be done. Our parks are the jewel of the NYC parks system and as more people discover this, the more congested and used the parks will become. Active, clean and accessible parks are vital to the health of all community. Our goal is to make sure that our parks remain the jewel that they are.

To meet this goal we need to do the following:

- Fill in the funding gaps from NYC & NYS Parks
- Expand volunteer, arts, education and cultural programming
- Promote community investment to meet park upkeep needs and manage growth from over 9,000 new apartments expected in the next 5 years.

Long Island City will experience incredible growth in the foreseeable future. We look forward to working with our community partners, residents and stakeholders in the park to make sure that our parks and green spaces are given the resources and space they need to thrive. As the song goes, Long Island City's future is so bright we gotta wear shades.

We look forward to seeing everyone in the parks.



landscape architecture firms SWA/Balsey and WEISS/MANFREDI, Hunter's Point South Park Phase II transforms 5.5 acres of former abandoned industrial landscape into one of the most strikingly beautiful places in New York City. Phase II serves as a complement to the bustling activity of Phase I by offering places of retreat and contemplation as well as a strong connection to the waterfront and the natural vegetation of the area's past.

The park is a prime example of resilient waterfront design, featuring nearly 1.5 acres of tidal wetlands, berms, and bioswales which will protect against stormwater surges, runoff, and erosion.

Phase II of Hunter's Point South Park completes our remarkable 23 acres of connected waterfront parks in Long Island City that began with Gantry Plaza State Park's construction 20 years ago. The LIC waterfront now truly has something for everyone and we hope you are taking full advantage of all it has to offer.

The Conservancy would like to thank Councilman Jimmy Van Bramer for his tireless work towards making this park a reality.

JAZZY THURSDAYS

The Conservancy surveyed the community in early 2018 to find out what types of programming we should do. The number one response was music, and specifically jazz music.

In response, we launched our "Jazzy Thursdays" music series in mid-July. Each Thursday evening until the beginning of September, the Conservancy hosted local musicians at LIC Landing for intimate performances that were a hit with the local community.

CINEMALIC

Now in its fifth year, our CinemaLIC movie series continues to bring huge crowds to the waterfront to enjoy free outdoor movies with the best backdrop in all of New York City.

Movie attendance this year reached 2,800 combined viewers, with a crowd of nearly 750 showing up for our kick-off event of Wizard of Oz on June 9.

This year's movies showcased a wide range of eras and genres, but all were fun for the whole family. We screened Wizard of Oz, Moonstruck, Sleepless in Seattle, Butch Cassidy and the Sundance Kid, and Ratatouille.


CHEERS TO QNS! BEER FESTIVAL

We held 27 free evening yoga classes, taught by Joy Chen of Cosmic Fit Club and Virna Sanabria of Surya Yoga Academy, 9 Zumba classes with Sophie Walters of Sophie Walters Fitness & Cosmic Fit Club, and for the first year brought 4 free pilates courses to the park with LIC Pilates.

In addition, we continued our partnership with lululemon to host 9 free Saturday morning yoga classes and a yoga and wellness festival at the end of the season attended by 500 people. Thanks to the many local artisans, fitness professionals, and other vendors who participated.





WATERCOLORS ON THE WATERFRONT

Throughout the summer of 2018, the Conservancy put on seven watercolor painting nights at LIC Landing. This free art programming was hosted in partnership with local artist Donna Levinstone who was on hand to provide tips and pointers to our over 300 participants.

SALSA

The ever-popular Wednesdays on the Waterfront Salsa Nights returned to Hunter's Point South Park this year, hosted by LIC-based Martinez Dance Studio. In total, five of these free dance parties were hosted and brought out over 700 revelers to dance, commune, and celebrate on the waterfront.

DANCE FESTIVALS

The waterfront once again played host to two remarkable dance festivals in the summer of 2018. On August 4 and 5, Insitu Dance Festival took over the entire LIC waterfront with 144 performances by 22 dance companies in four parks. The festival drew over 8,000 visitors and activated our parks in a unique and awe-inspiring way.

On September 13 and 14 the Queensboro Dance Festival brought excitement to Hunter's Point South Park with 14 performances from Queens-based dance companies and a very special performance from the Inner Mongolian Performing Arts Troupe, who performed for the first time ever in New York City.

Gardening

Hunters Point Parks Conservancy continued to grow our role as stewards of the park by expanding our volunteer gardening program in 2018. We continued to hold our bi-weekly Saturday morning gardening sessions in partnership with New York Cares between May and October (albeit a few rain outs) which drew hundreds of people, some neighbors, some from across the city. In addition, we built on partnerships with business and community groups in the neighborhood, bringing out seven corporate groups and one school for gardening days, and partnering with a local boathouse for two shoreline cleanups. We held 21 gardening and cleanup events this year and were joined by 700 volunteers who contributed nearly 1,500 hours of service.



BULBFEST

On Saturday, November 3 we wrapped up our season of volunteer gardening events with the 4th Annual LIC Bulbfest. Over two weekends we planted 7,600 daffodils, tulips and alliums throughout Gantry Plaza State Park and Hunter's Point South Park. Come Spring 2019, our waterfront parks will be blooming with excitement! Thank you to Van Zyverden for donating the bulbs and to Con Edison for sponsoring our season of gardening activities.









IMPROVING OUR PARKS

In addition to providing volunteer labor to keep the parks clean and healthy, the Conservancy has also contributed financially and through activism.

This past year, the Conservancy was awarded a grant through Parks Trails New York to purchase new wayfinding signage throughout Gantry Plaza State Park, which was installed at the beginning of the summer. We also contributed financially towards purchasing twelve new picnic tables which were installed in early October.









