Letter from the President

Awesome, Beautiful, Relaxing, Breathtaking, Community - these are all words park goers used to describe their experience in our Waterfront Parks. As President, I take pride in these descriptions. The Hunters Point Parks Conservancy works tirelessly to make sure Hunter's Point South Park and Gantry Plaza State Park remain welcoming, safe and fun places for all.

The Conservancy had many aggressive goals for 2019 and we worked hard to meet them. Some highlights include:

- 1. Environmental Education We partnered with Newtown Creek Alliance to bring a place-based urban ecology curriculum to two LIC middle schools. We also partnered with Hunter's Point Community Middle School to create an after-school gardening club for students in 6th to 8th grade.
- 2. Summer Kids We partnered with Gantry Parents Association for our fourth year of free summer programming that consisted of 46 classes for 3,100 kids in areas of art, music, fitness, dance, STEM and more.
- **3. Gardening** We brought in over 1,000 volunteers who collected 680 bags of weeds, planted 10,000 bulbs, and helped with other necessary projects in both parks. We also had 18 corporate and community groups that came out to team build and keep the parks clean.
- 4. Fitness We strongly advocate for healthy living, and in addition to our 5K run in June that drew 1,300 runners, we hosted 53 free fitness classes with participation of over 3,500 people.

2020 will be another busy year with Long Island City continuing to grow and numerous residential buildings rising fast around the park perimeter. Our parks are no longer a well-kept secret but now are a well known oasis for all to enjoy. We dream of a unified Queens waterfront going from Newtown Creek to Astoria that provides enjoyment, serenity, activity, resiliency and most importantly community for all.

Please review the rest of our Annual Report to see what can be accomplished when we all work together. We greatly appreciate the support we get from our community, corporate sponsors, elected officials, parks officials and the 108 Precinct. We appreciate all your feedback and ideas and look forward to seeing everyone in the park in 2020.

This year the Conservancy began work in a new focus area: environmental education. We partnered with Newtown Creek Alliance to bring a place-based urban ecology curriculum to two LIC middle schools.

HPPC received funding from TF Cornerstone to help Newtown Creek Alliance write two units (Climate Change Adaptation & History and Geography of Newtown Creek) and expand the program into LIC.

HPPC & NCA worked together to train nine teachers, five from Hunter's Point Community Middle School and four from PS/IS 78, in the curriculum and how to integrate it into their existing lesson plans. The lessons and activities have been implemented in the classroom, and we look forward to expanding the program.





GARDENING CLUB

The Conservancy also partnered with Hunter's Point Community Middle School to create an after-school gardening club for students in 6th to 8th grade.

The program was piloted in the Spring 2019 semester with 10 students and continued in the fall with 15. HPPC and teachers at the middle school led the students in weeding, restoring, and replanting a school garden space on the corner of Borden Ave. & Center Blvd. that had been neglected for years. Students were also able to work on a few projects in Hunter's Point South Park with the help of NYC Parks gardeners and learned about the importance of parks to the health of their community.

Thank you to Macy's for helping to launch the program and TF Cornerstone for providing funding to continue it this fall. Thanks to HPCMS principal Sarah Goodman and teachers Mary Mathai and Daniel Agosto who made it possible!







Summer Kids at the Landing Movies & Music

In July and August the Conservancy held our fourth year of Summer Kids at the Landing in partnership with Gantry Parent Association.

2019 saw continued success of the program, with 46 free classes and activities attended by over 3,100 children. Activities included music, art, fitness, storytelling, dance, STEM, and more.

Waterfront Fitness Art & Dance



DANCE FESTIVALS

The waterfront once again played host to some fantastic dance performances. On September 5 the Queensboro Dance Festival brought excitement to Hunter's Point South Park with 9 performances from Queens-based dance companies across diverse disciplines ranging from tap to modern to African dance. The Conservancy also partnered with the Queensboro Dance Festival to bring several free family dance classes to the park. Workshops for all ages in hip-hop, classical Indian dance, Irish dance, Capoeira, and acroyoga were attended by over 150 aspiring dancers.

The Conservancy threw a free community silent disco, co-hosted by Councilman Jimmy Van Bramer. This was our largest and most popular event of the year, bringing out 1,500 dancers to the park and lighting up the waterfront.



Hunters Point Parks Conservancy continued to grow our role as stewards of the parks by expanding our volunteer gardening program in 2019.

We once again held our bi-weekly Saturday morning gardening sessions in partnership with New York Cares between May and October which drew hundreds of people, some neighbors, some from across the city.

We also expanded our partnerships with businesses and community groups in the neighborhood, bringing out 18 corporate and community groups for mid-week gardening projects. In addition, we did our first leaf raking and compost education volunteer activity in November in partnership with Big Reuse.

In total, 33 gardening and cleanup events were held that drew over 1,089 volunteers who removed 680 bags of garbage, weeds, and leaves from the parks -- a record achievement. Thank you to Parks & Trails New York, Con Edison, and Queens Borough President Melinda Katz for supporting our volunteer gardening program and helping

IMPROVING OUR PARKS

In addition to providing volunteers to help keep the parks clean and healthy, the Conservancy also advocated with other organizations for more funding.

At the beginning of the year, HPPC was awarded a grant through Parks and Trails New York to purchase new hammocks for Gantry Plaza State Park as well as some additional gardening tools and plants. We also worked with volunteers from Goldman Sachs to purchase and plant thousands of flowers at Hunter's Point South Park near LIC Landing.




